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| Introduction | This plan describes our commitment to deliver high quality remote education in the event of school being fully or partially closed. It has been written in accordance with the most up to date DfE guidance and local safeguarding policies and procedures. |
| To enable teaching and learning to continue as effectively as possible during the need for remote learning: | <ul style="list-style-type: none">● We will make daily contact with children via Google Classroom/Tapestry or by phone● We will use a mixture of live lessons, written/practical work and computer- based tasks appropriate to the age group. We will provide clear explanations of new content using high quality resources and pre-recorded videos when live lessons are not possible.● In the event that the whole class is at home, we will provide a daily 'Meet' to enable much needed social contact with the and between the children● We will monitor the engagement of pupils and their learning and provide them with supportive feedback● We will communicate regularly with families through email, School Rush, phone calls and the website● We will expect all pupils to complete work to the best of their ability● We will provide a broad and balanced curriculum which is age appropriate and covers the same core learning the child would have received in the school day |
| Our staff will: | <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Provide a suggested weekly timetable● Share daily learning tasks through Google Classroom and on Tapestry (Nursery/Reception) which are available from 9 am● Provide appropriate feedback to children each week to support children with their learning● Contact parents if work is not being submitted or standard of work has noticeably decreased● Monitor the academic progress of pupils with /without access to online learning resources and arrange strategies for support accordingly● Additional support strategies and mechanisms will be put in place for children with identified needs |

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| Our pupils/students will be expected to: | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Log on to Google Classroom/Tapestry each day and answer the registration question by 9am ● Complete all learning tasks set on time so feedback can be given ● Talk with friends and teacher through Google Meet/ Google Classroom ● Use other online resources such as Purple Mash/Spag.com/Times Tables Rock Stars |
| Parents are responsible for: | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ensuring their children are ready to learn each day: dressed appropriately and in a safe space for learning by 9am - Ensuring children register online by 9am - Supporting their children to complete all of the learning set on time so feedback can be given. - Liaising with school staff and seeking support on behalf of their child when needed - Ensuring courtesy and politeness to any member of staff within any communication - Providing access to the learning offered for their children - Ensuring their children are safe online - Informing the school if their children are unwell and will not be accessing online lessons. |
| How to access work: | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Search for 'Google Classroom' using Google Chrome - Go to 'Classroom' - Log in using email address and password (this can be found in the planner) - Select Class Page - Click on the 'classwork' tab at the top of the page - Activities highlighted in colour are still to be completed - Once an assignment has been completed, type to answer question and 'mark as done' or click 'hand in' |
