
Talk 4 Writing

In English this term, we focus on non fiction texts, starting with a non-chronolgical report on the River Amazon.

We will use the information writing toolkit to then write our own report on the River Wey.

After, we will use our Science learning on the circulatory system to write an explanation text on how the heart works.





Maths

Maths begins with adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions.

After that, we will read and write decimals using Base 10 materials before moving on to dividing and multiplying decimals by 1-digit numbers with no regrouping or renaming. This will culminate in using the term's learning to convert units of measurement using fractions and decimals.
