
MATHS

During Maths in Spring 1 we will continue to focus on fluency with daily practice of the four operations. We will also be working on finding percentages of whole numbers, looking at how to approach word problems, and exploring measurements and ratio.

Quick recall of times tables remains a key target for many of the children in Year 6. We would be very grateful if you could continue to work on these with your child and remind them to use Times Tables Rock Stars more frequently.

READING

We will continue with our class novel, 'Holes' by Louis Sachar, in January. It is a fitting story alongside our Crime and Punishment topic following the story of Stanley Yelnats - who is accused and punished for 'stealing' a pair of trainers.






WRITING

Our Talk for Writing returns to a narrative focus this half term, where we will look at the character toolkit, whilst refining our skills at using dialogue to further develop the character in a story as well as helping to move our stories on.

SCIENCE

In science we will be exploring the topic of Evolution. We will be investigating how living things change over time through natural selection and adaptation.



History

In History we will be looking at how crime and punishment has changed over the past 1000 years. We will look at stories about criminals and how fairly they were dealt with.



RE

In RE we will be thinking about what helps Muslims to live a good life. We will explore the key beliefs and practices of Islam through investigating the five 'pillars'.




FRENCH

They will also learn the language for a variety of physical activities and will be presented with a healthy recipe. There will be a focus on developing extended sentences around this topic.

PE

During our Monday sessions, we will be developing our hockey skills. In our PSD lessons we will be working on our gymnastics skills.



ONLINE SAFETY

As your children grow older we know of the pressure on them (and you!) for them to be online using social media. We are aware that children in Year 6 are using social media to communicate, and we regularly see first-hand the damage that is happening when they use apps such as WhatsApp. Such apps are not equipped with the safety features that would make them appropriate for primary aged children. For your information I have included the age restrictions for many of the common apps that children access and use, against their terms and conditions of use.
