




# ST MARK & ALL SAINTS READING NEWSLETTER



2026 is the NATIONAL YEAR OF READING so we are looking forward to launching some new events in the coming months.






Over the years, Beech class have loved reading about the popular bear, Paddington this year! **A Bear Called Paddington** by Michael Bond





### What is your favourite children's book and why?


